BACKGROUND:

HRDR provides information on education and professional development in support of the principle of lifelong learning. It designs and disseminates recruitment materials, conducts recruiting activities, and encourages participation in recruitment at the grassroots level of the profession. The office communicates with libraries on issues relating to management of human resources and acts as an advocate for "best practices" in these areas.

In support of HRDR's programmatic priorities, the office manages the ALA-Wide Scholarship Clearinghouse, JobLIST Placement Center (at MW, Annual and division national conferences) and Librarycareers.org website. In support of its leadership development mission, the office coordinates the Emerging Leaders program, ALA/Council Committee Chair Orientation and ALA Internship program.

As part of its liaison duties, the HRDR staff supports the following ALA committees and round tables: COE; COSWL; HRDR Advisory; Scholarship & Study Grants; TOLD; LEANRT; LIRT; LSSIRT, NMRT and SORT. They also support four scholarship juries and two Assemblies (Education and Recruitment).

JobLIST Placement Center

ACRL National Conference

HRDR staff attended the ACRL National Conference in Philadelphia to manage the JobLIST Placement Center operations. They hosted a first-timers networking event in order to inform attendees of the placement services and activities during the conference. Volunteers conducted resume reviews and mock interviews. A successful Open House was held where academic employers were able to meet with job seekers to talk about open positions and quality of life issues on their various campuses.

The New Members Round Table (NMRT) will once again partner with the center in providing a resume critiquing service to conference attendees. The service is available anytime the center is open.

Open House

The will be an Open House from 10:30 a.m. - noon on Sunday, June 26, 2011 in the Annual Conference in New Orleans. Representatives from various libraries and library-related companies will have an opportunity to talk about their individual work environments with conference attendees. They will discuss various aspects that make their institutions unique – such as work culture, facilities, sports, music, arts, campus and community life, etc. As with the center

during ACRL, employers will showcase the activities available in and around their institutions that highlight the quality of life. 17 employers have preregistered for the event.

Recruitment Assembly

Office for Diversity IMLS Grant Support

HRDR is supporting the Office for Diversity by assisting with the efforts to provide training to its cohort of leaders who have volunteered to be a part of an IMLS grant funded program, entitled: *Discovering Librarianship*. During the Midwinter Meeting in San Diego, Lorelle Swader spoke to the newest cohort of leaders and shared information about the areas of: professional educational preparation, career paths within libraries and the general career outlook.

Career Fairs

On April 6, 2011 HRDR worked with International Relations Office (which coordinates the Money Smart program) to staff a table at the College Smart Fair 2011, sponsored by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission. The fair was designed to assist Illinois high school students and their parents, as well as adults returning to college, to prepare for college. In addition to various workshops, attendees also had the opportunity to talk to representatives from Illinois colleges, universities, governmental offices, and other organizations such as ALA. Questions were answered about the librarian profession and required education.

Emerging Leaders Program

Poster Session

The 2011 class of Emerging Leaders (EL) will once again have an opportunity to meet attendees of the ALA Annual Conference at their poster session and reception. The event is held on Friday, June 24; 3 - 4 p.m., MCC – Rm. 271 – 273.

Webinars

On March 22, 2011, a webinar was presented by Pat Wagner of Pattern Research, Inc. and it was entitled "Influence, When You Don't Have Power or Authority." During the session, Pat discussed ways to build influence, avoid certain mistakes, and take action to become an effective leader. On Thursday, April 21, 2011 the cohort participated in additional webinar entitled: "ALA Demystified: How to be Effective within ALA." Leslie Burger, a Past President of ALA (and creator of the Emerging Leaders program), shared her strategies on getting the most out of the ALA experience. She noted that the American Library Association is a large multi-faceted organization that offers members many opportunities to learn, grow, share, network, and lead.

EL Interest Group Summit

The Emerging Leaders Summit is offered each year at Annual, and is open to all classes of Emerging Leaders. The Summit is planned by the Emerging Leaders Interest Group (ELIG) Steering Committee, a group comprised of all Emerged Leaders. This year's Summit theme will be: "You've Emerged, Now What: The Emerged Leader Toolkit, Saturday, June 25th 1:30 - 3:30 p.m., MCC 245.

Committee Activities

Committee on the Status of Women in Librarianship (COSWL)

COSWL will be hosting two programs at the 2011 ALA Annual Conference in New Orleans. They provide the opportunity to focus on topics of importance to the status of women in librarianship.

The first session, entitled "Introduction to Women's Issues," which will be held from 1:30 - 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 25, provides an opportunity to discuss the issues of caregivers. The presentation is co-sponsored by the Association of College and Research Libraries Women's Studies Section (ACRLWSS) and the Social Responsibilities Round Table-Feminist Task Force (SRRT-FTF). Women comprise 46 % of the total U. S. workforce but 61% of caregivers. More than half of working caregivers say they have to go into work late and leave early or take time off during the day to provide care for children, parents, spouses, other relatives or non-family members. In 2008 COWSL member Sharyn Ladner undertook a caregiver survey of library workers. As a result of the findings, COSWL is launching a campaign to raise awareness of care-giving issues and their affects on the lives, work, family and health of many librarians and library support staff. Data from the 2008 survey will be presented as well as a kickoff for the development of a Toolkit for librarians and library workers.

The second session, entitled "Right Here I See My Own Books: A History of the Woman's Library at the Chicago World's Fair, 1893," will be held on Sunday, June 26 from 10:30 a.m. - noon . In this session, Sarah Wadsworth, associate professor, Marquette University, will discuss her manuscript on the subject based on her article from Libraries & Culture, winter 2006. This presentation discusses the history and analyzes the contents of the 1893 Chicago World's Fair exhibit. The Women's Library was put together by women and consists of works written only by women for the Chicago World's Fair in 1893. The discussion will be continued at the Library History Roundtable (LHRT) Ed Holley Lecture from 10:30 a.m. - noon on Monday June 27, 2011.
