- Whereas, Lane S. Thompson was a life-long library user and supporter, perhaps because his father had been the assistant director of the Washington, D.C. Public Library; and
- Whereas, Lane served as an appointed Library Commissioner for the Fairbanks (Alaska) North Star Borough from Dec., 1992 until one month before his death in July,2010; and
- Whereas, Lane served two terms as Chairperson of the Commission during the first expansion of the main library, and he was instrumental in promoting the fundraising for that effort; and
- Whereas, Lane was appointed to the Alaska State Library Advisory Board for two terms from 2000 to 2004 during the period when the Board wrote the first statewide library development plan; and
- Whereas, Lane was outspoken with public officials and took strong stands in support of intellectual freedom, confidentiality and privacy, and other library issues; and
- Whereas, From his obituary, "He challenged people to think for themselves, pursue human rights with compassion, read, learn and ask a lot of questions. He strived to make the world a fairer and better place to live;" now, therefore, be it
- Resolved, That the American Library Association (ALA), on behalf of its members:
 - 1. Recognizes the significant contributions of Lane Thompson to the libraries and users of the Fairbanks North Star Borough and of the state of Alaska; and
